Student Rules for Florida Trip

By allowing your child to attend this trip, you are accepting the policies and regulations stated below as well as those stated within the band handbook. Mr. Scott’s decisions to discipline matters during the course of the trip are final. Students on this trip represent Cario Middle School, the Cario band program, Mr. Scott and the town of Mt. Pleasant. Proper behavior is a must.

The policies and regulations of the Cario Band Program must be followed to the letter when we travel. Students who violate the rules below may be removed from the trip immediately. Severe infractions will result in the parents of the student being required to travel to Florida to transport the student home immediately and at the parents' expense.

1. Students are not allowed to leave the parks without their chaperone.
2. Students are expected to be on time at ALL call times.
3. Students are expected to be appropriately dressed in the specific shirts called for each day.
4. Students must follow all curfews without exception.
5. Students are not allowed UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES to leave their room after evening taping.
6. Students will not exit their room in the morning until chaperones instruct them to do so.
7. There is a ZERO TOLERANCE of the possession and/or use of narcotics, alcohol or tobacco on the trip. Students in possession of these materials risk school suspension/expulsion, police intervention, and immediate dismissal from the Cario Band program.
8. Students are expected to behave appropriately in the hotel. We are not the only guests.
9. Students are expected to behave appropriately at all times while in the parks and at the performance venue.
10. Theft of any nature will result in school suspension/expulsion, police intervention and immediate dismissal from the Cario band.
11. Vandalism of any type will not be tolerated. Students and their parents will be responsible for any damage due to their child’s behavior.
12. No weapons of any kind (or objects that look like weapons) are permitted.
13. If you think that Mr. Scott won’t like it, DON’T DO IT!

Bus Guidelines

It is important that the driver be able to focus at all times on his job. We will make every effort possible to assist our driver. Please become familiar with our bus policies.

1. Students have been given assigned seats on the bus. Students may not change seats during the trip, except with their bus partner (aisle to window.) Adults will be seated throughout the bus to minimize noise. We reserve the right to change assigned seating, if necessary.
2. Unless otherwise instructed by the driver, students and parents are not to place luggage or instruments under the bus. Chaperones will be in charge of supervising luggage and equipment being loaded.
3. No one should be on the bus without driver supervision at any time. If a student forgets something on the bus, they must be supervised by a chaperone for the entire time the student is on the bus.
4. Students are not to bring food or drinks on the bus (THIS INCLUDES GUM AND CANDY).
5. Students are to stay on the bus until given instructions to get off.
6. No radios or iPod may be used with exterior speakers. Furthermore, any CD's and/or music brought by students will be reviewed by Mr. Scott or a chaperone. Music using profane or vulgar language will not be allowed and will be confiscated.
7. Valuables should not be left on the bus. The band and the bus company assume NO responsibility for stolen items improperly stored.
8. The bus becomes a "silent bus" any time we are in city limits or below 35 MPH. This allows our bus driver to concentrate on the road and his directions, as well as allowing us to become focused on the task at hand.
9. No sitting on the armrests or on top of the seats.
10. Absolutely no flash photography on the bus. This blinds the driver temporarily.
11. Carryon luggage must fit in the storage bin above the seat or completely underneath your seat. No items may be placed in the bus aisle.
12. Cario band students represent some of our finest students. We hold them to very high expectations.

Hotel Guidelines

1. Do not enter your rooms until a damage assessment has been done.
2. Hotel rooms are to be kept clean at all times.
3. Curfew is the law. PERIOD.
4. Lights out means no television or telephone/cell phone use.
5. Students will not be permitted in the hotel swimming pool.
6. No pay phone use at hotels.
7. Students will not be allowed in the hotel rooms of the opposite sex under any circumstances.
8. Students are expected to move quickly and quietly to their rooms upon evening return to the hotel. Roaming the halls will not be permitted.
9. On the last day, students should wait in their rooms until their chaperone does a final room check. Once the room has been cleared, the chaperone will release you to go down and place your bag in your Chaperone's group area in the lobby. Then go eat breakfast. Your chaperone will tell you then how much time you have to eat before you need to be seated in your Chaperone group. When they have checked everyone in, they will lead their students to the buses.

Florida Packing List

Clothing

- ✓ Wear good walking shoes (not new). Be careful with sandals, especially in the Magic Kingdom, Animal Kingdom, and Hollywood Studios. Sandals become painful after many hours of walking. Tennis shoes are strongly recommended. CROCS ARE THE BEST!!!!
- ✓ Shorts are your best bet for central Florida in spring, but a pair or two of long pants won't hurt to have either). ABSOLUTELY NO DENIM IN THE PARKS. Denim takes forever to dry out and is very uncomfortable. Shorts need to be of acceptable length to attend school.
- ✓ We will be wearing our trip T-shirts on this trip to make it easier to recognize our students. You will get these t-shirts prior to departure. SWIMSUITS ARE NOT ALLOWED ON THIS TRIP, EXCEPT at the water park. This includes wearing bikini tops under t-shirts!
- ✓ Swimsuit and towel for water parks. Towels may be rented at the parks.
- ✓ Bring a wind-breaker and/or rain jacket.
- ✓ Pack a sweatshirt if you need one for air-conditioned spaces.
- ✓ Never underestimate the power of a dry pair of socks or dry shoes after water rides.
- ✓ Underwear – including the day at the water park for the trip home.
- ✓ Toiletries
- ✓ Instrument and music.

Accessories

- ✓ There aren't very many clocks in the park, so WEAR A WATCH!
- ✓ Don't forget a hat, sunscreen (especially you pasty white types!), and a cinch bag/wallet/ money belt for keeping your meal cards, money and phone cards.
- ✓ We encourage all students to bring a pillow and a blanket for the overnight bus trip.
- ✓ Students may bring a CD player/iPod on the bus, provided it is only listened to through ear buds or headphones. Students should not bring inappropriate music to listen to.... iPods will be confiscated. CD players/iPods are not allowed in the park at any time.
- ✓ Students are not allowed to bring any type of video gaming system on this trip.
- ✓ Pack some snacks in your suitcase for your room. You will want to avoid the high price of hotel and park snacks as much as possible. Remember: snacks are not allowed on the bus.
- ✓ Bring a camera! I recommend a disposable camera, preferably one that is waterproof.
- ✓ Bring a baggie to protect your cell phone on water rides.
- ✓ Bring a plastic bag or two for wet swimsuits and towels.

Money

Bring a Minimum of \$50 in Cash.

Students should not travel with less than \$50 cash. This will be enough to pay for additional food, snacks, or souvenirs in the park. All other expenses are covered in the trip cost.

Carry-On Bags

What to bring on the bus for Thursday

Since you will not be getting your suitcase out from under the bus until we check into the hotel on Thursday night, make sure you have everything for the day at Animal Kingdom Studios in your carry-on bag.

What to wear on the bus for Thursday

You will be trying to sleep on the bus Thursday morning, so consider wearing “comfy” clothes --- sweats or flannels—during the ride.

Changing into day clothes at the Rest Area

We will be stopping in the Welcome to Florida Center. You can change into your day clothes there, so make sure your clothes for Thursday are in your carry on and not your suitcase. We will also eat breakfast from Chick fil a. A chicken biscuit or two, bottle of water, and cup of fruit. No special orders unless you have allergies. Anyone with allergies needs to check with Kim Huff (Cario School Nurse).

What to bring in your Carry on for Thursday

- ✓ Blue Band T-shirt
- ✓ Shorts, Socks and Shoes
- ✓ Sunscreen
- ✓ Phone charger
- ✓ Money
- ✓ Think through your day carefully as you pack so you won't forget anything!

Medications

We are aware that some students are on regular medication. We will abide by the medical guidelines as outlined on the CCSD website. Parents and students with medication will be required to check-in with the Kim Huff to turn in medications and discuss any self-medicating needs (EpiPen, inhalers, etc.) Prescription medication must be in a pharmacy-labeled bottle with dosage instructions and the child's name on the label. Your signed CCSD medical forms must be submitted to the school nurse so she can compile the forms in a binder for the medical chaperone. Please contact the school nurse if you have questions about the procedures, or your child gets sick right before the trip.

CCSD Self-Medication and Self-Monitoring Forms

Per the school nurse: The CCSD Self Medication/Self-Monitoring forms must be pre-approved by Kim Huff. All CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES need to be placed on a CCSD Physician Medication Order Form. All controlled substances will be kept with an adult in a locked container and administered by a trained CCSD employee. NO STUDENT WILL BE ALLOWED TO KEEP CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES ON THEIR PERSON.

Infraction	Recommended Consequence(s)
Arguing	1 hour with chaperone in park

Important Student Reminders

- Chaperones will remind students to keep drinking water throughout the day.
- Chaperones will give students their meal cards during check in breaks and remind them to eat their meals.

Student Bus Seat Assignments & Luggage

- Students will not necessarily be on the same bus as their chaperone. More than likely the groups will be on all three busses.
- All student luggage will be located on the chaperone’s bus, to ensure that luggage is not lost and for ease of loading and unloading.

Locker Rental

Theme Parks and Water Parks

- Multi-use, key-operated lockers can be opened and closed as often as you like.
- A \$5 refundable deposit is required for the locker key. Keys must be turned in within an hour of park closing.

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Multi-Park Locker Rentals

When visiting more than one park per day, simply return your locker key to receive your original \$5 deposit. Then, present your receipt (plus the deposit) at the second theme park to gain access to another locker for the remainder of the day at no additional cost.

Epcot, Disney’s Hollywood Studios and Disney’s Animal Kingdom Park

Single-use, coin-operated lockers are located near Epcot, Disney’s Animal Kingdom Park and Disney's Hollywood Studios bus Information booths. The cost is between \$.50 and \$1.00. Quarters must be inserted each time the locker is locked.

Lost & Found

Locating a missing item depends on where the item might have been lost. Please explore the locations below for details about Lost and Found policies. If you lost an item at one of the parks and your item has been missing for at least 24 hours, then you may call Theme Parks Lost and Found at (407) 824-4245. Guests under 18 years of age must have parent or guardian permission to call.

Transportation & Ticket Center (TTC)

Every location has its own policy, but after a specific length time, found items may get delivered to the Transportation & Ticket Center. It is located north of the [Magic Kingdom parking lot](#) and east of [Disney’s Polynesian Village Resort](#). The Transportation & Ticket Center can be accessed by ferryboat from [Magic Kingdom park](#), by car or by all [monorail](#) lines.

Parks

Items found at theme parks and water parks are turned in to the specific park’s Lost and Found at Guest Relations, where they will be held for that day only. After the park closes, items are delivered to the Theme Parks Lost and Found at the Transportation and Ticket Center (TTC).

<input type="checkbox"/>	Good Walking Shoes. Tennis Shoes are the best. NO NEW SHOES. Bring an extra pair of shoes in case one gets wet.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Money belt or Cario Band Ditty Bag for keeping your Disney ticket, meal cards, money, and cell phone.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Ziploc bag to protect your cell phone while on wet rides.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Gallon size Ziploc bag to place wet bathing suit and/or towel for Sunday's water park trip
<input type="checkbox"/>	Shorts for 4 days, with at least one pair of Khaki Shorts for the workshop. NO DENIM
<input type="checkbox"/>	Wind Breaker or Light Jacket/Sweatshirt for air-conditioned spaces
